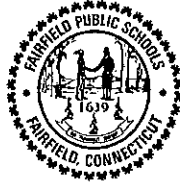

Additionally, we are thrilled to report that the library has opened earlier than expected. BOB will be making a farewell visit next week. We will now focus our attention to the remediation of the gymnasium. This area will be closed for the remainder of the school year. Due to the anticipated expense of this project, it falls under a “capital improvement” project and must go before Town bodies for approval. At this time, we don’t have a firm estimate on when this project will be approved or scheduled.

Please know that we have worked diligently to obtain full building usage, and regret the many inconveniences that students and staff have endured. With the successful re-opening of the Library Media Center, we hope that some normalcy has returned. Thank you for your understanding and support as we move forward with the Town process to regain use of the gymnasium.

Subject: PK-2 Math Curriculum Revision Update

The purpose of this memo is to share with you an update of the PK-2 math curriculum revision work. Below you will find information about the process used to revise the curriculum before it comes to you for consideration on February 26, 2013. Additionally, I have provided information related to consideration of a student text and the development of the math instructional model. I look forward to sharing more information with you at the curriculum presentation next month.

**Curriculum** (What students should know and be able to do at a given grade level)

June 2012 – Present

- PK- 2 mathematics curriculum revisions made by teachers and curriculum leader

November 29, 2012

- PK-2 draft curriculum and survey posted online

December 7, 2012

- Parent Focus Group conducted

February 26, 2013

- Presentation of the proposed PK-2 mathematics curriculum documents to the Board of Education

March 12, 2013

- Board of Education vote on the PK-2 mathematics curriculum

**Student Textbook/Resource Review** (Support materials to help teachers deliver the curriculum)

Spring – August 2012

- Preliminary review of student resources

October 2012

- Textbook screening team selected resources to present to the district committee

December 10 – 11, 2012

- District Textbook/Resource Review Committee consisting of classroom teachers, Math/Science teachers, administrators, consultants, parents, PTA Council representatives

January 2013 – February 2013

- School visits based on feedback from the District Textbook/Resource Review Committee

January 2013 – February 2013

- Teacher trials conducted using four of the selected textbooks

**Instructional Model** (How the curriculum is delivered)

February 2012

- Teacher professional development on mathematics instructional model

February 2012 – June 2012

- Teachers voluntarily implemented instructional model strategies with support from the Math/Science Teacher

Summer 2012

- Teachers developed units of study aligned to current curriculum incorporating instructional model strategies

August 2012

- Teachers received full day professional development on units of study

November 6, 2012

- Teachers received follow-up professional development on units of study

Fall 2012

- All teachers implemented a unit of study with Math/Science Teacher support as a form of embedded professional development

February 2013

- Teachers will receive continued professional development on instructional model

Spring 2013

- All teachers will implement a second unit of study with Math/Science Teacher support as a form of embedded professional development
