Advanced Placement Scores and Trends


Attached please find a document representing the Advanced Placement results from 2003 – 2013. The chart displays AP participation and performance rates over the past eleven years. The graph is a visual display of AP enrollment and tests results since 2003.

The term "index" is a calculation used to identify high performing school districts. A list of these districts is published annually on the Washington Post web site and in Newsweek. It is a simple formula: divide the number of AP exams administered by the number of students in grade 12. Any high school with an index score of 1.0 or better appears on the list.

Please note the following:

- The number of AP tests increased, along with an 11% increase in AP enrollment.
- While enrollment increased, we have maintained a high percentage of scores at 3 or higher. This is a significant accomplishment.
- The AP course and exam allow students to experience college level rigor while still in high school. We will continue to review our AP program, look for opportunities to add AP courses to the Program of Studies, and support all students who seek the level of instruction that this coursework requires.

FWBC Meeting Minutes, 10/3/2013

FWBC Members present: Bill Sapone, Kim Marshall, Vic DeMaria and Doreen Battimelli

Others present: Sal Morabito, Perry Liu, Judy Ewing, Gary Rosado, Tim Yahn, Ralph Martin and Jennifer Carpenter

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes of the 4/4/13 meeting were approved - vote 4/0 The minutes of the 7/30/13 meeting were approved - vote 4/0

Budget Summary by Chairman:

Chairman Sapone gave the committee an overview of the budget prior to approving the last project change orders.

- There had been a long negotiation process to close several outstanding change orders.
 A&R Electric claims ended up in arbitration. A&R started with a claim of around \$336,000 of which roughly \$65,000 was accounted for in the previous project budget. Final settlement was about \$225,000.
- TSK Architects will pay \$36,000 back to the project to avoid an E&O claim regarding the auditorium lights.
- Malkin Construction will forgo their 'shared saving' plus another \$4,000 +/- to balance the budget.
- A long outstanding invoice from HB Communications for roughly \$20,000 will not be paid. With the anticipated approval of the final change orders the project budget will be spent.

Change Order Approval:

PCOs 102 through 107 totaling \$88,718.51 were approved 4/0.

Invoice Approvals:

Malkin Construction invoice for \$180,721.12 was approved 3/0/1.

Discussion regarding disbanding the committee:

Chairman Sapone stated no more meeting of the FWBC are planned. A motion was made to allow the Executive Committee to take care of any remaining items. Motion was approved 4/0.

Chairman Sapone noted that there are still outstanding items that the committee no longer has the funds to pursue. He stated that he will send the BOE a letter summarizing outstanding items left over from the construct project so that the Town and/or BOE can seek to complete them. He also noted that the final commissioning report from Van Zelm Engineers will be sent shortly.
