BOARD OF EDUCATION RETURNS MONEY TO TOWN

The Fairfield Public Schools will be returning approximately \$345,000 to the Town of Fairfield from its 2011-2012 operating budget, according to Board of Education Chairman Pamela Iacono. An unanticipated reduction in electricity costs, negotiated by the Town after the budget was adopted, is the primary reason that the Board of Education could take this action.

“I am pleased that the school district is able to return these funds to help the Town through these difficult economic times,” Ms. Iacono said. “The Board is pleased that the Superintendent and his staff were able to make this happen.”

In addition to savings in electricity costs, the Board also experienced additional staff retirements and a milder than expected winter. Some savings were offset by unanticipated expenditures such as the replacement of a boiler at Fairfield Warde High School and fixing the roof at McKinley elementary school.
