Simsbury – accelerated math courses

Brookfield - Daily Humanities class replaces ELA. (1.5 FTE)

Guilford- no program

South Windsor- EXCEL program for grades 4-12

Cheshire- pullout plus in-class enrichment, acceleration and independent study

Madison- no pull-out program but program under review

Trumbull- they had a program, but eliminated due to budget cuts last year

Fairfield County Schools

Greenwich – Middle school students participate in an interdisciplinary seminar program and accelerated math. There is a part time teacher in each middle school.

Westport – Each middle school has a full time teacher and aide who pullout each identified student in grades 6-7 for three hours/week and who work with classroom teacher to plan enrichment and acceleration. Grade 8 students meet every other week.

New Canaan – has a program for grades 3-8.

Darien – In grades 6-9, classes are scheduled as part of the student's program of study. Throughout the grades, thematic, interdisciplinary units of study are provided.

Redding – Grades 3-4 only

Westin - Grades 6-8: Identified students elect TAG as one of their Practical Fine Arts (PFA) courses and meet with the TAG teacher for two 45 minute periods each week and one 45 minute period on alternate Fridays. New students are admitted in January and May.

Wilton - In middle school, students are offered independent study choices and have the option of accelerated programs in math class.

Stamford - Program redesign in progress.
