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## Superintendent's Message



I am pleased to share news from around the school district with you.

### Sherman Elementary School Project

On September 27 the Representative Town Meeting approved \$50,000 for architect's fees to begin the design of the core upgrades and renovations at Sherman Elementary School. This project is scheduled to include an expansion of the cafeteria and its serving lines, bathroom upgrades, security enhancements, improved fresh air circulation, among other things. The construction cost of this project is estimated at \$1.6 million and will be managed by the Special Projects Standing Building Committee. Work is scheduled for summer of 2011.

### Long Range Facilities Planning

With the Sherman project on track, the Board of Education has turned its attention to updating its Long-Range Facilities Plan. On August 30 the Board of Finance convened a joint planning meeting with the Board of Selectmen, representatives from the Board of Education and the Representative Town Meeting. The First Selectman outlined his vision for the Town's Long-Range Facilities Plan, including an estimate for the Board of Education. The Board's Facilities sub-committee is taking that information and developing its recommended Long-Range Facilities Plan for consideration by the full Board of Education.

### Operational Audit

The firm of Prismatic, Inc. continues its work on the operational audit of the Fairfield Public Schools. Many thanks to those of you who met with the on-site team during the week of October 11 through 14. The audit report will be presented to the public at the December 14, 2010 Board of Education meeting. The report will contain commendations as well as recommendations. The Board will consider all of the recommendations but is not required to implement them. Once we receive the report, I will prepare a response to each recommendation in the report for the Board's consideration.

### New Website

With a redesign and a new name, the Fairfield Public Schools' website has officially launched. When you have a chance, check out the new site [www.fairfieldschools.org](http://www.fairfieldschools.org). It continues to be a work in progress. Some people have asked if this means that our email addresses will be changing. For the time being, the email addresses remain the same. It is possible that next summer we will change our email addresses to mirror the web address, but that change is more complicated than altering the district's domain name.



**Tara Hyder, Jennings Reading & Language Arts Consultant**, was selected as a recipient of the *Brian Fagan Grant*. This grant recognizes outstanding teachers who demonstrate leadership and are currently enrolled in an academic program for administration certification.

The **Early Childhood Center** recently held their first *ECC Colors for Caring Collection*. On the last Thursday of each month, students and staff are encouraged to wear clothing of a designated color. September was red. The ECC selects a different charity each month, and families are given the opportunity to make a donation, as the family budget allows. In September, toiletries were brought in for *Operation Hope*. The ECC motto is "never too young to help others!"

The **Fairfield Warde HS Faculty** project, *Casual Dress Days for Charity*, that occurs on payday Fridays, has raised over \$1,200 for *Operation Hope*.

The **Holland Hill Cross Country Team** started again this year under the guidance of PE teacher, Anthony Gelsi. The team is made up of 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders who volunteer their mornings on Tuesday and Thursday to log in as many miles as possible. The goal is to promote healthy choices and activities.
