Scheduling:

Summer enrichment will run two sessions: Session I—July 5—July 15 and Session II—July 18—July 29. Students can attend summer enrichment for two weeks or four weeks. Additionally, courses will run for 1 or 2 hours. As you complete the registration form, be sure to schedule at least six courses for each session in the event that some courses close due to minimum/maximum enrollment requirements. The Instructional Office will use this information to develop your child's schedule. Schedules will be mailed to your home in May. At registration, please be sure to include any material fees as indicated in the brochure. Course and material fees are to be paid in full at the time of registration.

Locations:

Elementary Summer Enrichment will be located at two school sites. The PreK-2 summer enrichment program will be held at Osborn Hill Elementary School and the 3-5 summer enrichment program will be held at Burr Elementary School. Safety Town will be held at Burr Elementary School. Start times for summer enrichment have been staggered in consideration of drop-off and pick-up at two locations.




