INTERMEDIATE ART

Statement of Purpose

For art to be deemed exemplary, it must show the application of skills beyond a basic level and reflect a personal style.

In this first level beyond Foundations, students will use observational, inquiry based thinking skills and will develop a greater understanding of imagination and personal expression. They will learn to recognize artistic styles throughout art history. They will also be exposed to the critique process which will help them to improve their own work and to develop visual literacy.

Design and Description

Students will develop their artistic skills and creativity; build on what they learned in Foundations in Art. Students will explore composition and techniques in painting, drawing, designing, and printmaking. Students are required to complete homework assignments in a sketchbook.
